I stayed with the school for a year, then left to join a school called Kagiso Barolong in the rural areas of Mahikeng. I worked there for a number of years before I went on to join a school called Boitsenape in the early 2000. After some years with the school I went to Johannesburg and joined Diepsloot secondary, I became HOD for the department of Maths and science for 3 years.

I was later invited to join Taletso in 2013, where I was teaching Maths and Maths Lit at Lichtenburg Campus. In 2016 I joined Taletso Mahikeng Campus, fast forward to 2021/22 a post for Campus Manager was advertised, I applied and went for the interview and later received a call informing me about my appointment for the position of Taletso TVET College Mahikeng Campus Manager"

Mr Phiri further explains that for him the teaching and learning space is a purpose he has always felt the need to fulfill. He chose to be a teacher because of his need to develop the African Child, to see the African child be innovative and one of the best in the world " After receiving my tertiary qualification I could been have anything else, I could have joined any other institution with maths and science outside of teaching, but I chose the space of education to develop an African Child. Historically we never had many opportunities, that we in today's time create for our students" the mission is clear and the tone is set, We are excited to see the implementation of the vision Mr Phiri has for Taletso TVET College Mahikeng Campus.

The event that was set to kick off in the early hours of Saturday morning, started a few shy hours late due to unforeseen circumstances as explained by a member of the organizing team. Despite the challenges faced, the event eventually started, and message of the day was delivered!

The day kicked off with a colour run/walk, followed by the main event which led up to the unveiling of the wall. The staff and students were welcomed officially by Mahikeng Campus Phiri, who opened the floor for the purpose of the day delivered by Student Support Service official Ms Khumo Merafe, Who then introduced us to our guests of the day.

Finance Manager Mr Sebaetse on behalf of the College management, Anele from gay umbrella who spoke on LGBTQIA+ rights, the importance of being comfortable and unapologetic about who you are, they further went to share their lived experiences as a transgender woman in South Africa.

The stage was then taken by HIV/AIDS awareness activist Mr Jack Mokgothu who explained the importance of learning instead of stigmatizing, to seek help and counseling and to remember that HIV is but a virus, not a death sentence.



The last Speaker, Advocate Mafilika from the Department Of Justice and Constitutional Development informed the audience about the different services offered by their Department in Support of LGBTQIA+ rights and GBV victims.

Once all the formalities were set and done, the crowd moved to the area of the Pride wall which is in front of the student hall under the guidance of the MC of the day Keaoleboga Musi, for the moment everyone had been waiting for, the unveiling under the theme "Pride is everyday"!

It is no secret that the LGBTQIA+ (Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, Queer, Intersex, Asexual, Plus) members of our different Communities experience discrimination, prejudice, stereotyping and violence on a daily basis based Solemnly on their sexual Orientation and identity. Taletso TVET College recognizes and acknowledges the LGBTQIA+ community in our institution, it is a priority to create a safe and inclusive space for Learners and staff who identify as LGBTQIA+.

Taletso TVET College continues to place its students in different work fields to acquire a much-needed experience in the work environment.

In their 2022 September placement, Work Based Exposure (WBE) team managed to place a total number 83 students and 4 of Mentors. WBE is a project initiated by DHET to expose all NCV Students in the exit level across all programmes to a real work environment.



I then applied at Taletso TVET College, I got accepted and did my N1- N6 with the institution. The road was not an easy one because there were some obstacles along the way. My passion and determination is what kept me going until I completed my course and graduated in May 2023.

Engineering generally has in the past been a male dominated field, it does get scary and overwhelming at times as we come across people in the field who see us as females first, before they see and a acknowledge us a engineers who are capable.

At the Moment, I am in a Bricklaying Apprenticeship program which I applied for at Taletso TVET College and was one of the 20 students who were Chosen for the project. It is a 3 year program where we do in service training in the trade, After 36 Months we will go for trade tests which will qualify us to be Artisans.

The work environment has it's up and downs. The downs mostly being your capability being questioned because of your gender and having to get used to the weight of the job, which gets better once you're used to. The Ups being the knowledge, skill and experience one attains along the journey.

When I got the field, I came with the mentality that I will not restrict myself in to learning. So, I have basically played a couple of roles on the project. I have done bricklaying, duties of a Clerk of works, a Supervisor, a Store Keeper, I have worked in the safety Office, and just other tasks that you would find being done in a construction project on site, the experience has been amazing since I started being in the field and doing the actual work, hearing of my progress from the people who have been my mentors motivates me to push and grow myself and knowledge in the field.



Even though I'm passionate about Civil Engineering, I don't want to focus on one type engineering at the moment, I want to know and have qualifications of other courses in the fields.

My goal is to work for more companies and work in more projects to acquire different skills that will enable me to one day run my own company and share my knowledge and skills with those who will be coming up after me. Engineering is a challenging but exciting field, I wouldn't trade what I am doing for anything else.


